Donald H. Miller

Retired state Supreme Court Judge

Donald H. Miller, retired Supreme Court Judge of the State of New York and resident of the Nottingham in Jamesville, died June 15, 2003. He was born in 1915 in Hastings.

He was a member of the Park Central Presbyterian Church and graduated from Syracuse University in 1938 and Syracuse University Law School in 1942.

Donald was a member of Phi Delta Phi/Law School Honorary and member of the Onondaga County Club. He served with the

U.S. Naval Reserve from 1942 to 1954 and retired as Lt. Commander serving in the South Pacific as an intelligence - P.T. Squadron Officer. He was awarded the Bronze Star and Commendation Ribbon.

Donald was a member of Hiscock and Barclay Law Firm from 1945 to 1974 and then served as a New York State Supreme Court Justice from 1974 to 1991.


